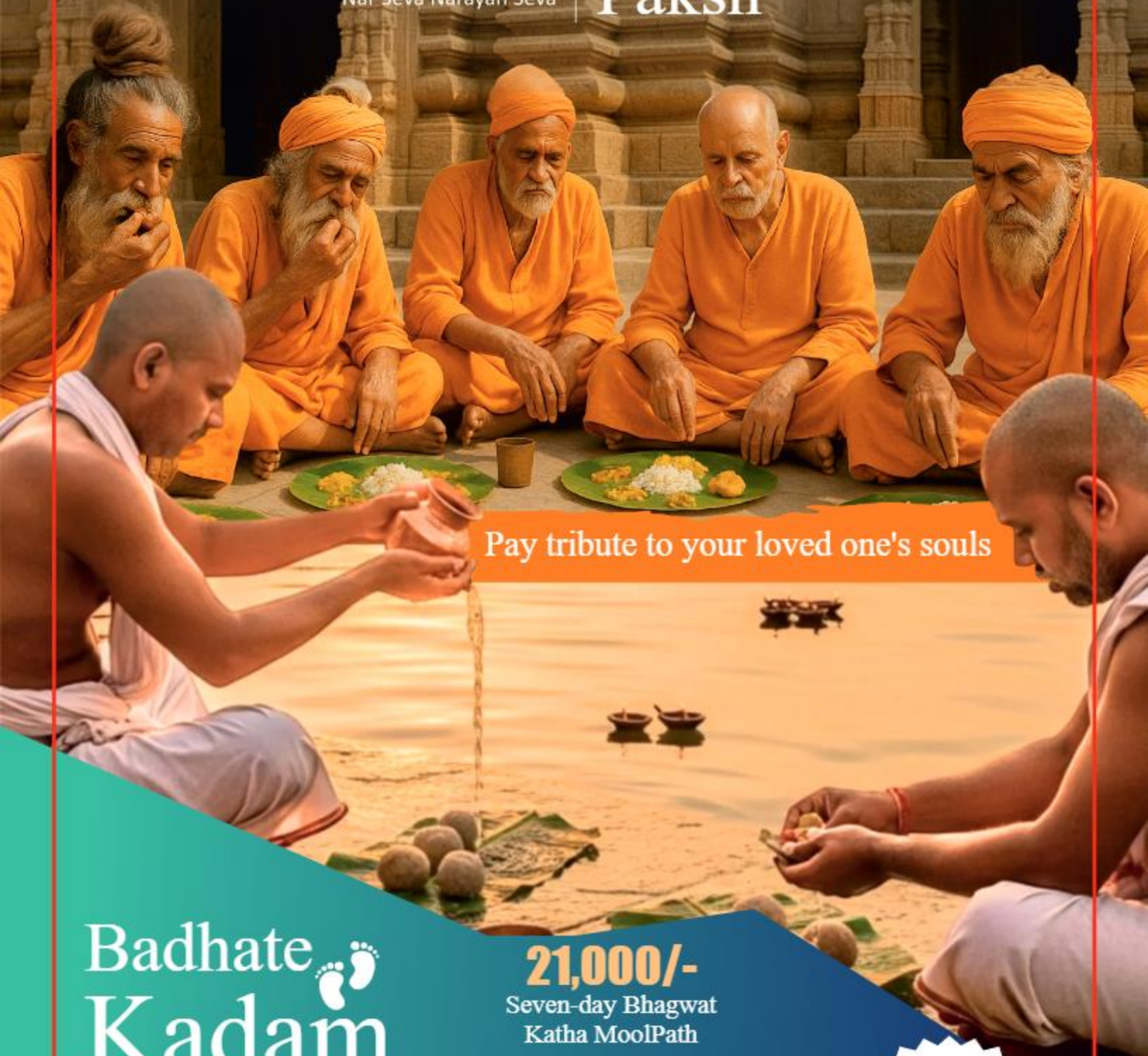

Nar Seva Narayan Seva

Narayan Seva Sansthan is a leading non-governmental organisation dedicated to human service, not only in India but worldwide. It was founded in 1976 with the compassion and spirit of service of Pujya Shri Kailash 'Manav' Ji. The Sansthan was officially registered on 23rd October 1985, with the motto 'Nar Seva Hi Narayan Seva' (Service to Humanity is Service to God). Beginning with food service for patients and their attendants, the Sansthan initiated service activities such as distributing grains, sattu, medicines, and clothes in tribal and hilly areas. In 1997, with the cooperation of Mumbai-based social worker Shri Chainraj Sanwatraj Ji Lodha, a special hospital for the differently-abled was established under the name 'Manav Mandir', where initially only 10-20 operations were performed daily.

Today, with the support of philanthropists and society, 90-100 free operations are being performed daily, and so far, 4,48,537 children and other individuals have been freed from disability.

At the Sansthan, 300-400 patients from across the country come daily for congenital polio corrective surgeries. X-ray, lab tests, medicines, food, and free accommodation for 1100 patients and their families are available. Approximately 3000 people dine at one time. After operations, tricycles, wheelchairs, calipers, etc., are provided free of cost to the differently-abled. So far, 37,967 people have been fitted with artificial limbs.

For economic rehabilitation, the Sansthan provides free training in skills like tailoring, mobile repairing, and mehndi to the differently-abled. Mass marriage ceremonies for poor and differently-abled couples are organised twice every year. So far, over 2,459 couples have tied the knot in 43 ceremonies.

Since 1991, the Sansthan has been operating an orphanage for 503 children, and 2401 tribal and rural children are receiving English-medium education at Narayan Children Academy.

From time to time, the Sansthan works to make society aware and cultured through programs such as de-addiction awareness campaigns, medical camps, Katha-Gyan Yagya (discourse-knowledge sacrifice), and Satsang (spiritual congregation).

The Sansthan's service system operates 24/7, with approximately 1000 dedicated workers, a team of 20 doctors, and 12 hospitals actively engaged in service. Over 480 branches operate in India, and the Sansthan is also registered in countries such as the U.K., U.S.A., Australia, Uganda, and Hong Kong. With the spirit of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' (The world is one family), Narayan Seva Sansthan is working as an inspiration for human service worldwide.





Service is the Best Virtue

The Triumph of Mehak's Spirit

Mehak's very first cry was met with difficulties; her first steps were fraught with challenges. From birth, both her legs were twisted. She was born an object of society's pity and sympathy. Her parents, from Gonda (Uttar Pradesh), immediately took this child to various hospitals, but everywhere they only received advice for massage. As she grew older, her difficulties also increased. Then she was taken to hospitals where, along with the advice for an operation, the cost was stated to be so high that the poor family couldn't bear it. The child could not walk properly, even though she also wished to run around and play like normal children. There were many dreams in her innocent eyes, but at every step, her body disappointed her. For a small child, enduring all this was extremely difficult. She often wondered to herself, 'Will I ever be able to walk on my own feet like others?' But where there is a will, there is a way.

One day, Mehak's father came to know about Narayan Seva Sansthan, Udaipur.



This was the moment when sinking hopes found the shore of expectations. The family reached Udaipur with Mehak.

The Sansthan's expert doctors examined her, and a plan for a two-stage operation was made. The treatment lasted for about 5-6 months – a long process involving two operations, bracing, physiotherapy, and continuous care. This period was no less than a test for Mehak and her family. But the struggle ended in light – the day Mehak took her first step on her straightened legs without any support. At that moment, the tears flowing from her eyes were not of pain, but symbols of the victory of her dreams. Full of confidence, Mehak says – 'Now I can walk well. Narayan Seva Sansthan has given me a new life. I thank them from the bottom of my heart.' This is the story of that faith and spirit that knows how to fight every difficulty. Mehak not only learned to walk but also gained the courage to fly. **Over 4 lakh 48 thousand differently-abled individuals worldwide have been freed from disability through free corrective surgeries.**



First Step on the Ground After Six Years, Mehak's First Cry Itself With Difficulties, But the First Step

Manvi Dalvi of Rohinkheda village in Buldhana district, Maharashtra, was born as a premature baby. Along with her birth, she also brought a challenge into her future life – both her legs were bent at the knees, and her feet were twisted. As she grew older, she could neither get up nor walk properly. Playing, running, and going to school – these were all denied to her. Her father, Yogesh Dalvi, is a bus driver, and her mother, Alka Devi, is a homemaker. Both made every possible effort for the treatment of their 6-year-old daughter, from Maharashtra to Pune. From neurologists to orthopaedic surgeons, every examination from her brain to her waist and feet was done, but no relief was found anywhere. She



returned hopelessly from every door. One day, they met an old acquaintance who had undergone a free polio corrective surgery at Narayan Seva Sansthan, Udaipur, in the year 2004, and had completely recovered. On his advice, after gathering information through social media, the Dalvi family arrived at the Sansthan with Manvi in April 2024. The Sansthan's expert medical team meticulously examined her and planned the treatment. The first operation was completed on April 20th, and the second on June 1st. A few days later, Manvi was given physiotherapy, wearing special calipers and shoes. After about four months of treatment and continuous care, that moment arrived when Manvi took her first step on the ground without support for the first time. Which was like a dream for her. The smile that appeared on her lips at that moment erased the hardships of the entire family as well. Now Manvi can stand on her feet, walk, and is filled with more confidence than ever before. In her parents' eyes, there is now no worry, but joy and contentment.



Ankit received a New Life with the Russian Ilizarov technique



Ankit is a small, lovely child. From birth, his legs were turned inwards, which made his life extremely challenging. Due to these bent legs, he could neither go to school nor play with other children. His parents made every possible effort for his treatment, but everywhere they were met with disappointment. No doctor could give Ankit an able-bodied life. One day, his parents came to know about Narayan Seva Sansthan. After which, they immediately boarded a train with Ankit. The next day, they reached the Sansthan located in Udaipur. There, his treatment began after a thorough examination by doctors. His treatment continued for several months using the Russian Ilizarov technique, without an operation. Now Ankit is perfectly healthy; his legs have become straight. He can stand on his own feet, walk around, and also ride a bicycle. Now Ankit is ready to live a new life.



Bhagirath's Triumph Over Adversity



Fifteen-year-old Bhagirath Mund (Jat) from Moondsar, a small hamlet 40 kilometres from Shridungargarh Tehsil in Bikaner district, Rajasthan, was born with a congenital physical deformity. The four fingers of his right hand were completely fused with the palm. This deformity of the fifteen-year-old eighth-grade student had gripped not only his hand but also his self-confidence. When the group of children played and laughed heartily in the hamlet's courtyard, Bhagirath often sat in a corner, hiding his hand in his clothes and crying. This was because children often made fun of him, taunted him, and stole his innocent laughter.

The Anguish of the Parents

Father Mohan Ram Mund toils day and night on his 30 bigha land. Mother Bhagwanti Devi equally supports her husband in animal husbandry and farming.

Treatment and Fading Hopes

When shown at the government hospital in Bikaner, doctors advised surgery but clearly stated, "There is no guarantee whether the hand will be corrected or not." The family also went to Jaipur and Jodhpur for treatment, but everywhere they received the same disheartening reply – 'We cannot say whether the fingers will open or not.' The family's hopes kept shattering.

A Ray of Hope

Just then, a person from the same village told the Mund family – 'My nephew's feet were completely turned backwards. But he is now perfectly fine after free surgery at Narayan Seva Sansthan in Udaipur.' Hearing this, a spark of hope returned to Bhagirath's family's dim eyes, and they reached the Sansthan in Udaipur for the first time on June 29, 2024. There, Dr. B.L. Shinde conducted a thorough examination and told Bhagirath in a firm voice, "Your hand will be completely fine." These words were like a blessing for the family and later proved to be true.

The Journey of Struggle and Victory

The first operation took place on July 7, 2024. The second operation on March 6 and the third operation on June 3, 2025. Today, Bhagirath smiles with pride and says, "Now I don't need to hide my hand anymore. Many thanks to the Sansthan."

The Road to Self-Reliance after the Accident: Rupesh

Rupesh Panwar (30) lived a life filled with dreams and the eagerness to move forward, just like any ordinary person. But three years ago, a tragic turn changed everything. Rupesh, from Yavatmal district in Maharashtra, met with a road accident. His injuries were so severe that doctors had to amputate his right leg above the knee. For him, this incident was nothing less than a bolt from the blue. A once self-reliant life suddenly became dependent on others. Every small or big task now seemed impossible without help.

His confidence began to shatter, and the direction of life turned blurry. Amidst depression and hardships, one

day, Rupesh came across information on social media about Narayan Seva Sansthan—an organisation that provides free artificial limbs to Divyangs, helping them stand on their own feet again. This news was like a ray of light in the darkness. He immediately reached the institute in Udaipur. Within just two days, his leg was measured and he was fitted with an artificial limb. When Rupesh took his first step with the support of the Narayan artificial leg, his eyes sparkled with joy, and his lips uttered the words—“Now, I too can walk on my own feet like others.”

The Sansthan not only gave Rupesh the strength to walk again but also showed him the path of self-reliance. Through the institute's free skill training centre, he began a course in mobile repairing. Gradually, he mastered this skill, and now he is working on opening his own mobile repair shop in his village to provide financial stability for his family.

With the support of Rotary Club Shivam, a free camp for Divyang operations, assessment, selection, and measurement for Narayan Modular Artificial Limbs and Calipers was organised on June 22 at La-Flora Resort, Garh Road. A total of 317 Divyang beneficiaries were served.

The camp was inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Hon'ble Minister of State for Energy, Government of Uttar Pradesh, Rajendra Ji Tomar. The Special Guest was Regional MLA Amit Agarwal. Patna

783 Differently-Abled Individuals Found a Purposeful Life

Dedicated to human service and the empowerment of the differently-abled, Narayan Seva Sansthan organised the Narayan Limb and Callipers Fitment Camp at Minerva Gardens, Champapet, Hyderabad, on August 17. In this camp, 783 differently-abled persons from various districts of Telangana, Maharashtra, and Andhra Pradesh were provided with 851 artificial hands, legs, and callipers free of cost. The camp was inaugurated with the divine blessings of Rashtrasant Pujya Lalitprabh Sagar Ji Maharaj Sa and Pujya Acharya Bhaktiratna Surishwar Ji Maharaj Sa.

Director Vandana Agarwal shared, “In the selection camp held last April, 1,100 patients had



come, out of which 783 differently-abled persons were selected. Today, all of them are starting a new journey of self-reliant life with Narayan Limbs and Callipers made with German technology.”

In the program, the differently-abled showcased a parade wearing their artificial limbs, while doctors provided training on walking and guidance regarding maintenance. A 70-member team of the organisation and 70 volunteers from the Cognizant Company offered their dedicated service at the camp. Free meals were arranged throughout the day for patients and their families. The vote of thanks was given by Devendra Chaubisa, and the event was coordinated by Mahim Jain.

Services of the organisation – Established in 1985, Narayan Seva Sansthan has so far provided more than 40,000 artificial limbs free of cost. Founder Shri Kailash Manav has been honoured with the Padma Shri for his humanitarian service; while recently, Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman awarded him for community service and social upliftment. Organisation President Prashant Agarwal was also honoured with the Presidential Award in 2023. Through medical services, education, skill development, and sports academies, the organisation has been empowering millions of differently-abled individuals to become self-reliant and connect with the mainstream of society. Through this Hyderabad camp, the organisation has taken a pledge to give a new direction to the lives of differently-abled people of Telangana.

In 2015, Narayan Children Academy (NCA) was established by the organisation to begin the journey of holistic development for those children who are deprived of education due to poverty and lack of resources. This English-medium school, operated at the organisation's Sevamahatirth (Lions ka Guda – Udaipur), provides children not only with value-based education but also with all those facilities that can be called world-class for learning.

At the school, children from nearby rural areas, daily wage labourers, and poor families are receiving education free of cost. These children belong to families where even their parents were deprived of education due to their circumstances. But today, seeing their children in neat uniforms acquiring digital education, they feel extremely happy. They are provided free uniforms, stationery and other study materials, transportation facilities, regular health checkups, well-equipped playgrounds and sports equipment, along with a natural and inclusive educational environment.

At present, 687 children are studying in various classes. Under the guidance of trained teachers, they are receiving a modern education and building a bright future for themselves and society.

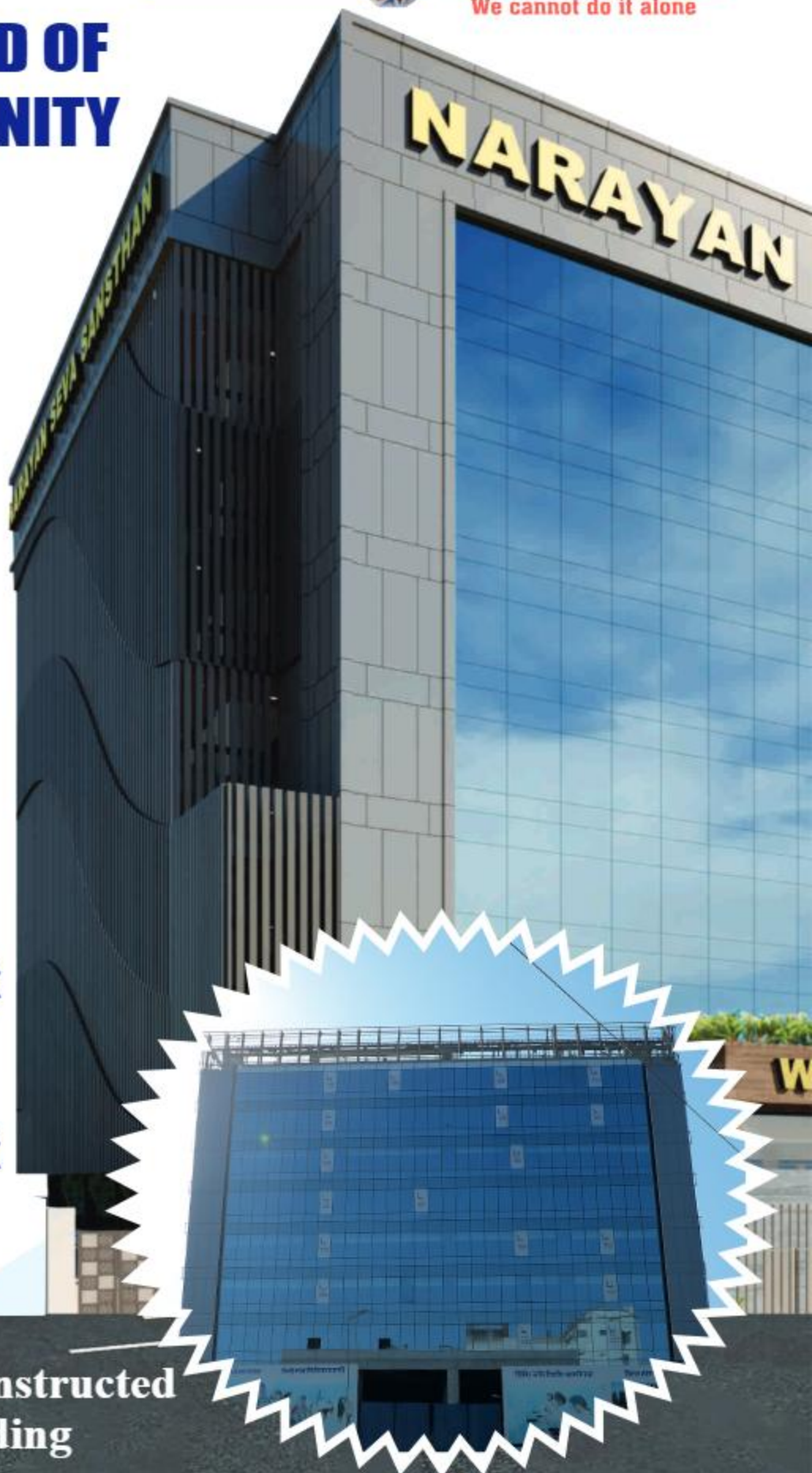
